#### **Sample Training Outline**

- Introduction & Objectives: Participants are welcomed with an overview of the course's purpose: to strengthen district-wide emergency preparedness through the structured use of the Incident Command System (ICS). The training explains how ICS provides a shared language and scalable organizational structure to streamline response in critical incidents. Goals for the session are reviewed, including improving coordination, clarifying roles, and applying district-specific Emergency Operations Plans (EOPs).
- Foundations of ICS: Covers the basics of ICS, including its history, terminology, and core principles. Entry-level participants will learn how ICS supports consistent, effective responses across agencies and departments. Key roles within the command structure are introduced, preparing staff to align their existing skills with appropriate ICS positions.
- Customized Tabletop Exercises: Participants engage in realistic, scenario-based tabletop exercises tailored to their district's size, organization, and unique risks. These simulations test response coordination, resource allocation, and communication protocols. Group debriefs follow each exercise to identify strengths and improvement areas.
- Role-Specific Response Training: Provides deeper instruction for specific ICS roles (e.g., Incident Commander, Operations Chief, Logistics).
