

Bus Driver Workplace Violence Prevention Training

This 4-hour program is designed for up to 35 school bus drivers and up to 50 total attendees to include dispatchers and other transportation department employees. KSL, Inc. This program includes response options for bus drivers to react safely to an emergency both on and off the bus as well as best practices for communication between the bus driver, dispatcher, and a 911 operator. The course also includes a slow speed driving course and the nationally recognized certified training program, "Stop the Bleed."

Sample Training Outline

- **Introduction & Objectives:** Overview of safety solutions for managing workplace violence and active threats within a school transportation setting. Introduces the nationally recognized "Run, Hide, Fight" principles and outlines appropriate driver responses before, during, and after a school crisis.
- **Stop the Bleed:** Participants receive hands-on instruction using specially developed training materials to learn and practice three life-saving bleeding control techniques, equipping them to respond effectively in high-risk scenarios.
- **Situational Awareness:** Attendees learn how to recognize potential threats from a distance, apply the OODA loop (Observe, Orient, Decide, Act) to respond appropriately, and evaluate available options based on their environment and circumstances.
- **Bus Stop Scenario:** Focuses on emergency response protocols while the bus is stationary. Drivers are trained to assess the situation, choose safe responses, and use site-specific resources based on threat level and location.
- **Moving Bus Scenario:** Simulated low-speed (under 15 mph) emergencies help drivers learn how to respond to violent or armed passengers while the vehicle is in motion, prioritizing student and personal safety.
- **Improvised Weapons:** Demonstrates the use of everyday items—such as fire extinguishers—as tools for defense during an active threat. Instructors guide participants in safe, practical methods of resistance when no other options are available.
- **Radio Communications:** Covers best practices for clear, effective communication between bus drivers, dispatchers, and emergency services. Emphasis on relaying accurate, actionable information to support rapid response.
- **Live Drill:** Attendees apply what they've learned in a scenario-based live drill, allowing for real-time assessment of decision-making, communication, and personal response techniques.
- **Q&A + Distribution of Materials:** Training wraps up with an open discussion and Q&A session. Attendees receive printed and digital take-home materials to reinforce training concepts and support continued preparedness.

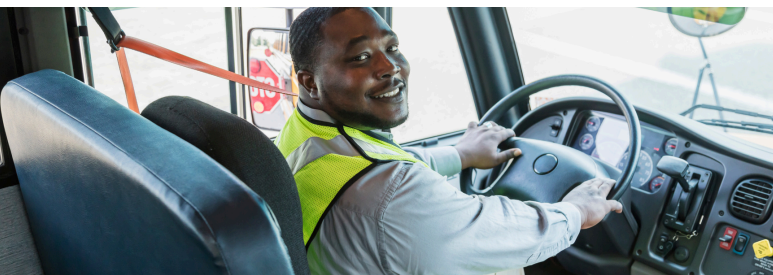
